TREASURER'S REPORT FOR NOVEMBER was accepted upon MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #325 and #501 through \$633 and #701 through #705 totaling \$287,519.22.

A MOTION by Dr. Lehrman approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the November payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

BIDS:

The bid for the school catalog was awarded to Gilliland Publishing Company on MOTION by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

A MOTION to confirm the acceptance of the bids for leasing five automobiles from Theisen Motors was accepted by MOTION from Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote unanious.

A MOTION to accept the bid of Norman Supply Company in Twin Falls for furnishing geothermal piping to the college was accepted on MOTION by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Jerry Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

- 1. We have had at least two different individuals looking at the Kimberly Road building with the idea of purchasing the building from the college.
- 2. We have opened a new outreach center in Wendell under the Title III grant that we received a year or so ago.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT CONTINUED:

- 3. We wish to express thanks to Idaho First National Bank for the new score boards in the gym.
- 4. There are a number of projects on campus that we need to consider and prioritize and start working on some of them. One of the projects would be the expansion of facilities at the fish hatchery. We have met with the University of Idaho and others in the aquaculture industry in Magic Valley, and we're pleased that the industry people indicated that they appreciate the working relationship with College of Southern Idaho. We do have some money saved in the fish hatchery account that would help with the construction there.

We would also look at completely remodeling the science laboratory.

We need to do some work on the Study Skills area.

We need to recarpet the Fine Arts Building. We may want to consider a new bond issue for expansion of the Fine Arts Building and an Economic Development Building. We need to set our direction for the next three, four, or five years.

- 5. Appreciation was expressed to the board for their attendance at the recent legislative meeting.
- ASSISTANT TO THE PRESIDENT: Dr. Mike Glenn made a presentation to the board indicating that some consideration was given to renting a wing of the new Chamber of Commerce building in conjunction with Region IV Development, Lewis-Clark, ISU and the College of Southern Idaho's economic development activities. He thought it would be a good move to combine all of these activities in one location including the Continuing Education arm of the College of Southern Idaho.
- BOARD RETREAT: Some time was spent discussing the possibility of a retreat for the Board of Trustees. It was decided that each trustee would indicate at least two or three open weekends in January and February and try to arrive at a time convenient to all.

Bids to lease five (5) cars for a period of three years were opened November 10, 1986. Bid specifications noted that the specifications were written as minimum requirements and that while the College's intent was to lease for three (3) years, legally, funds could be only allocated one year at a time.

Four companies entered the following bids:

# Con Poulus Chevrolet

Chev. Celebrity - 4 door - 6 cylinder

5 Cars @ \$295. Mo. = \$1,475. Mo. X 12 Mo. = \$17,700 per year

3 years X \$17,700 = \$53,100.

#### Thiesen Motors

Mercury Topaz - 4 door - 4 cylinder

5 Cars @ \$200. Mo. = \$1,000. Mo. X 12 Mo. = \$12,000 per year

3 years X \$12,000. = \$36,000. Option \$339. X 5 = \$1,695.

#### Roy Raymond Ford

Ford Tempos & Taurus - 4 door - 4 cylinder

- 5 Tempo Cars @ \$189.17 Mo. = \$945.85 Mo. X 12 Mo. = \$11,350.20 per year

#### Summary:

Roy Raymond Ford's bid of \$189.17 a month on a Ford Tempo was low and met minimum specifications. Thiesen Motors was next low with a bid of \$200. a month on a Mercury Topaz and exceeded minimum specifications. Thiesen's bid had the following advantages:

1. No mileage limit (Tempo had 15,000 mi.yr.)

2. Delivery - Thiesen's have cars for immediate delivery -

Roy Raymond up to three months delivery.

 Thiesen's Topaz has \$339. added of optional equipment including speed control, tilt wheel, rear window defrost, interval wipers, light group, etc.

4. The only body physical differences between the two are the Topaz is a little longer and weighs 40 lbs. more.

Considering delivery, mileage, and optional equipment, I recommend that we accept Theisen Motor's bid.

# BID SPECIFICATIONS COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO

## LEASE FOR 5 VEHICLES

The following bid specifications are minimum specifications. Options not listed but that can be shown as advantageous should be noted in writing. The College intent is to lease the vehicle for a three (3) year period but the College cannot legally obligate funds beyond its current fiscal year. Therefore, the lease document must contain the following provision:

"In the event that funds not be appropriated and shall not otherwise be available for any fiscal period of the customer following its current fiscal year then the customer may terminate this agreement without penalty by giving written notice at least 30 days prior to the end of its fiscal year".
